A copy of the "Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam" with a torn page which has been sought by police throughout Australia in the hope that it might provide the missing **clue** to the identity of the mystery Somerton **body**, has been **found** in Adelaide.

...was alleged that the three who had Communist affiliations, had come to Britain to instigate unrest during the London dock strike.

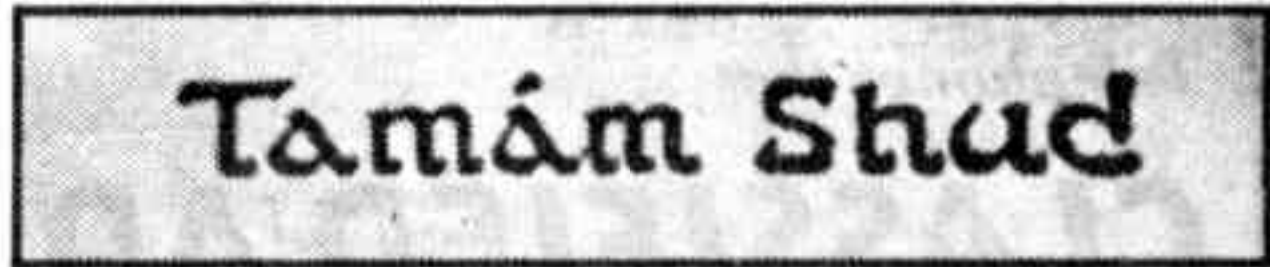
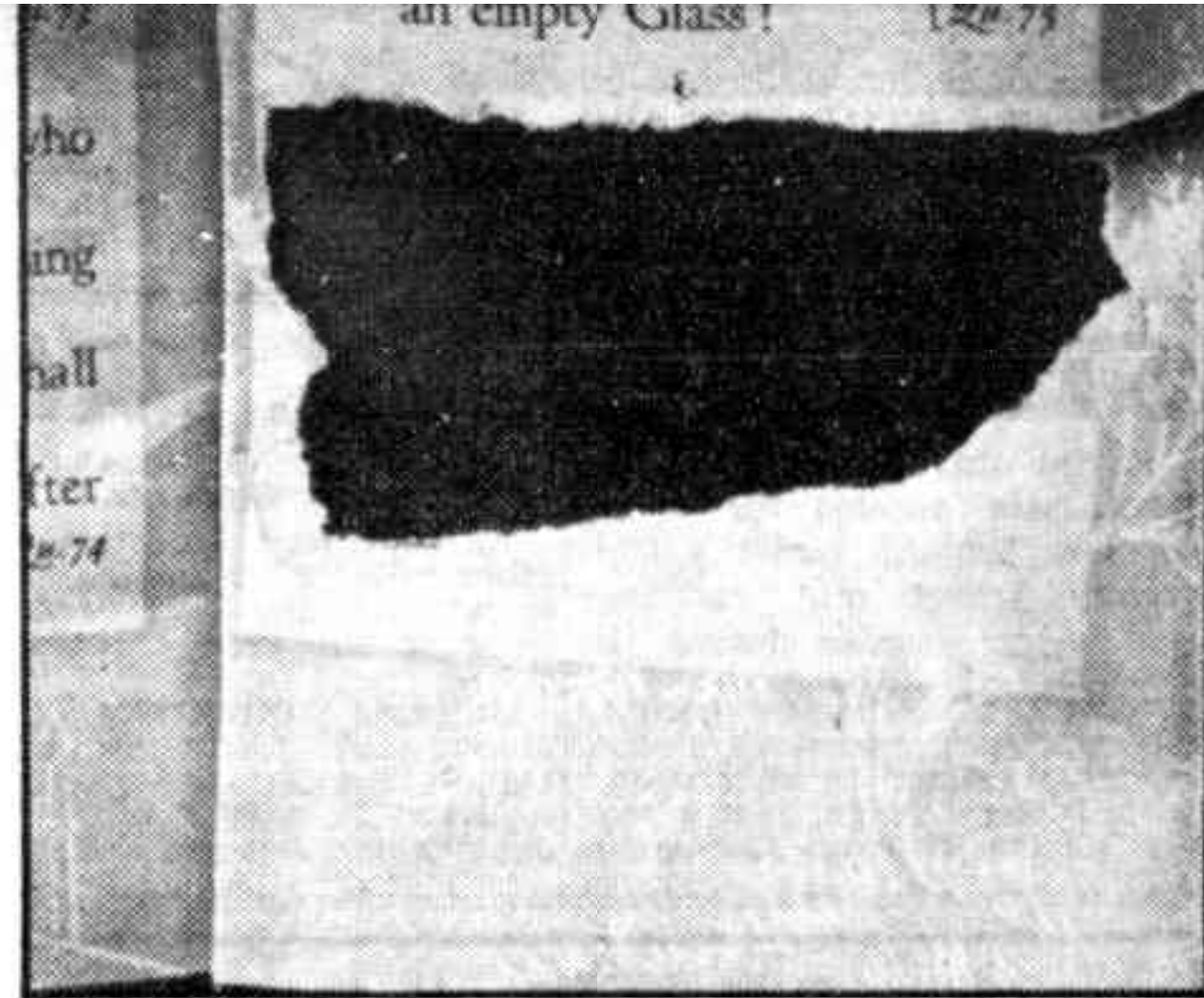
...Scotland Yard men escorted two of the men—John Maletta and Louis Goldblatt—to London airport and placed them in an aircraft for France.
